Project aim:

Due to sickness and need for emergency surgery project 2 has not progressed in the two months

Project 1

To improve information availability and sharing for children with epilepsy by improving electronically held information and developing epilepsy passports. As predicted the IT improvements are taking time to happen, but the team have been working on the introduction of the epilepsy passport. See Driver diagram.

Planned tests:

Project 1

Epilepsy passports have been tested 4 times with staff and 4 times with parents and changes made each time.

Results:

Project 1

Many alterations to the passports have been made and continue to be made before we start to roll these out more widely. To our surprise parents have suggested different ways to format and present the information not just what information is included, we are learning so much from the parents, much more than we anticipated!

What has also come about as an added positive is the fact that by creating the passport we have helped the families with communication and reduced duplication of work for the health professionals, one passport is now needed instead of health care plans for different settings.

Challenges / Successes:

Project 1

IT have created an alert for emergency seizure management plans – this feels a fantastic step forward, have now uploaded 50% of individualized emergency seizure plans. No feedback on the use of this yet as none of the children has come in acutely.

Next steps:

Also in addition York site had now been offered a weekly hour of supervision with a CAMHS consultant to help with supporting the team manage the mental health comorbidities in our patients. We need to actually set this up now and make it happen.
