Season's greetings to all,

The RCPCH Epilepsy Quality Improvement Programme (EQIP) launched their new training waves on 25th August 2021. Since then, participant paediatric epilepsy service teams have continued to impress the EQIP project team with their hard work and drive to make improvements to their services for children and young people with epilepsy. For the first time, the EQIP has piloted working with an Integrated Care System a that includes a regional network of paediatric epilepsy teams comprising six NHS Trusts. We look forward to sharing the great work they are currently collectively undertaking across several improvement interventions to improve their patients' first year of care experience.

We are very much aware of the pressure on NHS health service teams during this time and would therefore like to acknowledge the teams' continued commitment to the programme and celebrate the improvements that some teams have already achieved whilst on the EQIP such as: a reduction in first seizure referral waiting times, increased CYP and family engagement, digital customisation of the Epilepsy Passport and improving mental health pathways. We are truly inspired by the work and great efforts from all the participant teams.
