There is a well-established programme within the region that allows subspecialty training and modules. Sub-specialities include Paediatric neurology and Neurodisability, and modules include Forensic Paediatrics, Child Public Health, Paediatric Neurodisability, Children's palliative care and young people's health.

These include the diagnosis and management of long term Neurodisability, social communication difficulties, safeguarding, adoption and fostering and school-based issues including advice to the local authority.
			Both posts have acute on call duties, Salford being linked with Royal Bolton Hospital and Manchester with Royal Manchester Children's Hospital (RMCH).
			In either post the community child health trainee will be able to spend 70% of their time in community and 30% providing acute on call.
			Year 3 offers flexible options: Neurology or metabolic medicine at Royal Manchester Children's Hospital, further CCH in Salford or Manchester or in the other CCH grid approved posts in Bury, Wigan, Blackpool, Blackburn/Burnley and Trafford and Neurodisability in Preston, Bolton or Blackburn. The metabolic medicine, Neurodisability and neurology posts are currently approved for grid training in these specialities.

Whilst the full duration of training is offered in community settings, trainees may choose to spend time in Bristol Children's Hospital gaining experience in other relevant departments such as neurology if this is appropriate to career aims.</li> </ul>

This programme will provide the opportunity to gain experience in child development, paediatric neuro-disability, paediatric neurology, children's safeguarding, looked after children's health, paediatric palliative care, public health and children's mental health. There is an element of flexibility within the training programme to allow for other relevant training experiences. The weekly timetable includes a regular educational session as well as some flexible time for self-directed learning. There will be opportunity to be involved in quality improvement projects, teaching, and research throughout the training period.
