Awareness of the link between epilepsy and mental health


Aim/purpose: To develop and implement by Summer 2023 a mental health guide for all children and young people 11 to 17 focused on understanding and managing emotions

What is the problem: Many of our children are struggling with MH & wellbeing and not getting the appropriate help they require in a timely manner.

We often are not aware until they are really struggling and their school attendance and QOL is significantly affected. Long wait times for CAMHS


Driver Diagram


Primary Drivers


Stakeholder Map

What our tests revealed

- Face to face more popular than virtual
 - YP had a lot of worries unrelated to epilepsy
 - YP needed help with understanding/managing emotions
 - Parents needed help and support
- YP wanted to meet other YP with epilepsy

Team personal learning/Team highlights

- To not make assumptions
- Different ways of engaging with our children & YP for quick feedback
- The significant link with epilepsy and low mood/ anxiety
 - CAMHS referral not always necessary
 - How vital monthly team meetings are!

- Working with **CAMHS** and charities
- Learning about patient engagement and quick feedback

Challenges

- Nursing &doctors strikes
